Writing:

Using the story 'The Last Wolf' by Mini Grey, we will be writing a persuasive letter to try and convince characters to save the trees.

We will be learning to: use apostrophes; to add adjectives to our writing; to add the suffix -er and -est to words as well as learning how to use a range of conjunctions.

Computing:

We are going to be creating our own mini films with stop motion videos. We will use small toys and modelling clay to create our stories.

Art

Inspired by the work of Clarice Cliff, we will be creating landscapes on clay tiles. We will be learning to draw our local landscape before exploring how to imprint different natural patterns onto clay. Our end piece will be a landscape tile using all the skills we have learnt during the unit.

PE:

On Mondays the children will be focussing on athletics. On Wednesdays we will be learning 'striking and fielding' skills. Both of these lessons will be taking place outside so please make sure your child is dressed appropriately for the weather.

Extra-Curricular Learning:

Please continue to use Numbots and read with your child at home. Children can also use TTRS to practice their 2, 5 and 10 times tables. We will be going on our school trip to Charmouth on 18th May



PSHE:

We will be looking at the relationships we have with our family members, friends and our school community. We will look at the people that are able to help us.

Science:

In Science we will be learning all about plants. We will start by looking at the types of plants in our school environment and labelling their key parts. Next, we will look at different types of seeds and we will learn to classify them. Later in the half term we will be growing our own plants and looking at what plants need to grow.

Mathematics:

We are starting the half term off with learning about length and height. Children will learn to measure using cm and m. Next, we are going to start learning about money. Children will learn about all the coins and notes that they may encounter when paying for items in the shop. Finally, we will be using the data collected on our school trip to create tables and pictograms to present our findings.

Geography:

In our geography learning we will be learning all about the coasts of the UK. We will be looking at human and physical features and seeing these first hand on our trip to Charmouth. We will learn to collect data and present our findings.

Music:

Our topic this term is called 'Friendship Time' - we will be using our musical skills to sing, compose and improvise.

RE:

We will be looking at what Christians believe the good news is that Jesus brings. We will be looking at the stories of Matthew and the tax collector and the parable of the unforgiving servant.
