Writing:
 In English, we will be using the text 'Major Glad, Major Dizzy' to explore diary writing. Computing:
 Using Scratch Junior, we will be learning to programme algorithms so that that we can create a simple animation.

Art:
 We will be continuing our working on portrait painting inspired by Paul Klee. We will be exploring using shapes and different colours to express mood. During this process we will be learning to colour mix and what is meant by primary and secondary colours.

DT:
 In DT, we will be designing, making and evaluating our own thrones.

PSHE:

Science:
 We will be continuing to look at animals and their habitats. We will be looking at animals' adaptations and how they are suited to their environment. We will be working scientifically to collect data about the minibeasts that live on our school site.

Mathematics:
 This half term, we will be starting off by looking at multiplication and division. At the end of the term, we will be learning about measures and looking at how to calculate length and height.

History:
 We will be learning about British Monarchs this half term. We will be looking at the lives and impact of William the Conqueror and Elizabeth II. Using our comparing and contrasting skills, we will look at the similarities and differences in the way they ruled the British Isles.

 Our topic is called 'Zootime.' In this unit, we will be listening and appraising reggae music. We will then be learning about rhythm, pitch and pulse. Children will then be given the opportunity to improvise using our musical instruments.
